Music Notes

"O Splendor of God's Glory Bright" - Claudio Monteverdi (1567—1841)

This beautiful anthem originally scored for two violins, organ and choir, but played this morning with our two guest trumpeters, was adapted from a motet by the early baroque composer Claudio Monteverdi.

Monteverdi was an important connecting figure in music history, bridging the time between the renaissance and the early baroque period. As many of his contemporaries did, he worked in both the church and the courts. He is most famous as a pioneering figure in the development of the opera as a new musical form. The motet we are performing today with its words describing radiance and light, is an excellent choice for this Transfiguration Sunday and the Epiphany season. The text is as follows:



O splendor of God's glory bright,

O Thou that bringest light from light;

O Light of light, light's living spring,

O day, all days illumining.

O Thou true Sun, on us Thy glance Let fall in royal radiance; The Spirit's sanctifying beam Upon our earthly senses stream.

Creator, too, our prayers implore, Creator of glory evermore; Creator of all grace and might, to banish sin from our delight.

To guide whate're we nobly do, with love, all envy to subdue; to make ill fortune turn to fair, and give us grace, our wrongs to bear.


