Grace Commercial Kitchen

The Past: The Gift of a Commercial Kitchen

Grace's Commercial Kitchen was remodeled in 2006 - time and talent were provided by Project Coordinators Carol Evans and Ed Demmers. Treasure included donations. One private donation was \$200,000 (A Century of Grace 1906-2005).

Why a Commercial Kitchen?

The congregation and community groups require a safe, clean and high-functioning space for many volunteers to prepare large quantities of food. Many organizations can only use commercial kitchens.

September 2022: Cookies for Connaught

Grace volunteers baked 896 cookies for Connaught School - our Beltline neighbour - for a back to school celebration.

Did you know? Students at Connaught speak 45+ first languages!

Stewardship in Action:

- Talent: Relationships and project management: Identification of Beltline area needs through relationship with Connaught School, organize the space and volunteers. Operations staff ordered the supplies, helped set up, and cleaned the kitchen.
- Time: 8 volunteers and Rev. Jake gave 24 hours to bake 896 cookies
- Treasure: Donations powered the development of the commercial kitchen. Donations large and small pay for electricity, gas, operations staff to open the building and clean the kitchen and support volunteers with materials.

Monthly Fall Financial Update

Session Highlights: September 12 (Session meetings take place monthly. The October meeting is on Monday, October 3.)

- Opened with prayer and reflected upon Psalm 94
- Expressed thanks for the leadership of Kate Van Pernis as Coordinator of Children & Youth and the increased use of the church building, including revenue generating rentals
- Noted the need for nursery volunteers
- Agreed to receive new members during the October 9 worship service
- Established a team of elders to work with a prospective candidate in the discernment of becoming a candidate as a Minister of Word and Sacrament within The Presbyterian Church in Canada

- Received a very informative report on the Communications results and plans, including a calendar for the next year
- Agreed to continue including a Land Acknowledgement in the bulletin, to be read at the beginning of weekly worship
- Approved updates to the Congregational Roll
- Supported the creation of two new Deacon roles to build upon our pastoral care resources: a Deacon for Mental Health Care and a Deacon for Family Care
- Received updates on the programs that are overseen by the Engagement & Service Committee now underway (Food Bank, Connaught School, Cake Bake, Earth Care) and planned (English Language Learner classes, Community Hospitality Booth)
- Supported the integration of the continuing work of Truth, Healing and Reconcili-action into the workplan of the Engagement & Service Committee. The Ad Hoc Committee was dismissed with thanks.
- Approved Freda Pascoe joining the Human Resources Committee
- Agreed with the use of the Sanctuary for a thanksgiving service by the congregation of Our Saviour Anglican Church, as well as another gathering for KAIROS
- Received reports for information from Minister Resource, (which included highlights of the work of the Rev. Jake Van Pernis and the Rev. Dr. Jean Morris over the summer) and the Spiritual Growth Committee (which identified many faith formation programs and events underway through the fall for adults and children)
- Closed with prayer and a benediction.
- *Session Highlights are shared in the bulletin and posted on Grace's website following Session meetings.

Red Paint and Truth, Healing and Reconcili-action

October Update

Grace remains committed to the work of Truth, Healing and Reconcili-action. The Beltline Community and media have been highly engaged with Grace in this work. Events have drawn many of our diverse Beltline neighbours, and media coverage of Grace from September 25 to September 30 included event collaborator newsletters, a Beltline neighbourhood newsletter, and local, regional and national news. Social media participation has included Grace congregation members, other churches and ministers, Indigenous organizations and members, Beltline businesses, organizations and residents, the Presbyterian Church in Canada, non-profits, and more. This greatly extends Grace's audience and profile and we are extremely grateful.

- This work now takes place under the Engagement and Service Committee.
- Sunday, September 25 Ceremony and Prayer called Red Paint Painted Over took
 place to address the red paint, the tan paint, and to move into Grace having the
 doors repainted to their original colour. The media have been very interested in
 red paint updates. Coverage included CTV Calgary and Vancouver, CBC,
 the Calgary Herald (this story went national and appeared in the National Post).
 CTV and Global TV, in a story on Stardale Women's Group, also mentioned the
 October 30 Orange Shirt Day event at Grace, helping to promote the event.
- Work with an Indigenous artist is being done around creating a permanent marker- further information to come
- Grace co-hosted a Friday, September 30 event with Stardale Women's Group called Reconnection, Reconciliation and Resilience an event for hope and a better future in honour of Orange Shirt Day. The event expanded to become a Beltline community event with participation from Stardale, Grace, Urban Fair, the Beltline Neighbourhood Association, and the Canadian Race Relations

Foundation to help share the lived experience of Indigenous girls and women and issues they face in Calgary. Approximately 150 people attended, and social media and traditional media coverage amplified the event. This included an article in the Beltline Neighborhood newsletter The Beltline Brief, a <u>Calgary Herald article on what to do in Calgary for Orange Shirt Day</u>, a <u>Calgary Herald article on what happened in Calgary on Orange Shirt Day</u>, and Global TV. Stories included interviews with Stardale drummers, young Indigenous women who are working to share their stories and experiences of life in Calgary.

Last Month's Update: Tuesday, August 30 Update (following Monday, August 29 Session Meeting)

For context, the Session decision on the red paint is repeated this month.

At approximately 2:00 a.m. on the morning of Monday August 29, the red paint on the two sets of front doors of Grace were painted over with tan paint by unknown people (the sandstone and stained-glass windows were not impacted). Grace is working with the Calgary Police Service to investigate.

Grace's Session met on Monday, August 29 and made the decision that the east doors of Grace's building will be repainted, to the cream colour they have been, following a Sunday, September 25 gathering of prayer and ceremony that the congregation and community are invited to marking this new step on Grace's journey of Truth, Healing, and Reconciliation.

Grace's Session has also made the decision that a commemorative marker be made that reminds both Grace and the community of the story of the red paint on Grace's doors and the ongoing commitment to the work of truth, healing, and reconciliation. The congregation will be invited to share input about possible options for a commemorative marker. Announcements about how input on possible options for a commemorative marker will be announced in the bulletin, on Grace's website, and in worship.

Lead Minister Search Committee Fall Update

The Lead Minister Search Committee has received national and international applications and is confident God will bring us the candidate God has identified for Grace. We had hoped there would be a preach for the call this fall but that remains in God's hands. We continue to receive applications and interview candidates and will keep the congregation informed. Please continue to hold the committee and the candidates in your prayers.
