Monthly Fall Financial Update

Mural Project, Red Paint & Truth, Healing and Reconciliation Update Tuesday, August 30 Update (following Monday, August 29 Session Meeting) At approximately 2:00 a.m. on the morning of Monday August 29, the red paint on the two sets of front doors of Grace were painted over with tan paint by unknown people (the sandstone and stained-glass windows were not impacted). Grace is working with the Calgary Police Service to investigate.

Grace's Session met on Monday, August 29 and made the decision that the east doors of Grace's building will be repainted, to the cream colour they have been, starting on Sunday, September 25 following worship. The painting will be accompanied by a gathering of prayer and ceremony that the congregation and community are invited to marking this new step on Grace's journey of Truth, Healing, and Reconciliation.

Grace's Session has also made the decision that a commemorative marker be made that reminds both Grace and the community of the story of the red paint on Grace's doors and the ongoing commitment to the work of truth, healing, and reconciliation. The congregation will be invited to share input about possible options for a commemorative marker. Announcements about how input on possible options for a commemorative marker will be shared starting the week of September 5 and will be announced in the bulletin, on Grace's website, and in worship.

Mural Project/Red Paint July 2022 Update from July Session Meeting

At its July meeting, the Session considered the next steps for the red paint on the doors. Since its decision in November 2021 to create a mural relating to reconciliation, incorporating the red paint on the doors, there has continued to be extensive work to provide opportunities for the congregation and community to learn about the history of colonialism, residential schools and the role of the church, and to discern how God is calling us to respond.

Feedback from the congregation has been widely varied, and the Session observed that further education and engagement is required to build authentic and broad commitment to reconciliation. The Session strongly affirmed the principle underpinning the November 2021 decision, that is, that the red paint is to remain on the doors, as a reminder of that history and an encouragement to continue the journey of reconciliation. However, at this point, the painting of the murals will not proceed, pending a further discussion at the September meeting of the Session. (See August 29 update from this Session meeting.)

The Ad Hoc Committee for Truth, Healing & Reconcili-action is prayerfully reflecting upon the recent direction from the Session and will seek to provide further opportunities for Grace Presbyterian Church and the community to engage in this call to do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with our God.

The Lead Minister Search Committee has received national and international applications and is confident God will bring us the candidate God has identified for Grace. Session Highlights: July 14 (Next meeting September 14)

At its regular meeting on July 14, the Session:

- Opened with prayer and reflection on Isaiah 40:27-31 and the importance of waiting on the Lord.
- Was encouraged to hear of the fellowship enjoyed by the Choir at a recent BBQ, by the new and familiar faces at worship, and that Jake is returned
- Considered the June 26 Congregational meeting and shared feedback on the difficult topic. It was noted that the conversations are a reaffirmation of how we want to behave as Christians.
- Approved updates to the Roll of Professing Members and updates to the Elders' visitation districts. Individuals impacted by these changes will be contacted directly by their new Elder.
- Confirmed the role of Elders and the model of pastoral care and visitation at Grace. This will be further communicated with the congregation.
- Approved the baptism of Asha Persaud, planned for September 25.
- Was advised that Summer Sunday School is going well; additional leaders are needed for the regular Sunday School program starting in September. It is hoped that a Children & Youth Coordinator to help cover Maren's parental leave will soon be in place.
- Agreed with offering a new members class.
- Received the latest financial information, which indicates that expenses are lower than budgeted, while offerings are higher, although there is still a shortfall in the operating budget that is being covered by deferred contributions.
- Supported recommending to the Board of Ridge Rentals Ltd. that Robin Telfer be appointed President.
- Acknowledged the Spirit-led work of Chandra Mannix with the Community Care Booth. Recognition of Chandra's service as Deacon of Community Care will be planned for an upcoming worship service.
- Affirmed the principle of leaving the red paint on the front doors as an expression of Grace Church's commitment to this time of discomfort, prayer, learning and discernment, journeying towards transformation and reconciliation. The Session will consider the painting of murals again in September.
- Received an update on the Lead Minister search. Conversations with two candidates are underway.
- Referred correspondence regarding the 60th anniversary of the Chapel to the Ad hoc Chapel Renovation Committee.
- Agreed to move the regular meetings to the second Monday of the month, starting in September.
- Closed with prayer.


