



Music Notes

A note on music during the Lenten Season

The themes of reflection, preparation and penitence often permeate liturgical music during the forty days of Lent and a few practices have evolved in sacred music to meet the character of this important season which the Eastern Orthodox church calls the "season of bright sadness". Throughout history, composers of sacred music have sensitively created works for the two seasons of anticipation in the church; Advent and Lent, which both end with important days in the calendar, Christmas and Easter respectively.



Of course, one common practice we follow is the omitting of alleluias both spoken and sung, but another appropriate act in line with the practice of fasting is to do a "musical fast". That is, the tone of the music becomes more in line with the spirit of the season through the limiting of certain sounds. To accomplish this, often the organist will limit the number of stops (sounds) that are utilized in hymns and anthems, giving a more subdued overall sound to the worship service. The brilliant reeds and mixtures which give the organ a bright majestic sound is reserved for when we arrive at Easter and the end of this journey.

Acapella singing is musically appropriate, especially as we move towards Maundy Thursday and Good Friday when minimal instrumental accompaniment parallels the tone of Holy Week.

This penitent and solemn mood breaks with the glorious return of all the bells and whistles, brass and mixtures and reeds on Easter morning when the instruments spring to life once more to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus.

Living in Balance

Tsuut'ina artist Nathan Meguinis was commissioned by Grace to create a painting symbolizing truth, healing and reconciliation. The painting, titled *Living in Balance*, is now on display in the Family Room, until a permanent location is decided.



Artist's Statement

People of the Dene nation live a life of beautiful balance with the world around them and with other Indigenous Nations.

- The colour red represents Mother Earth. All the abstract human figures are red to show our connection to the earth with each one having a white outline which is our spirit.
- The braided sweetgrass circle represents lasting unity.
- The prints on the tree represent our prayers. These flags are tied on a poplar tree which represents life. Each colour has a meaning: Red Mother Earth; Green Plant Life; Blue Air and Water; Yellow Sun and Protection; and White Soul and Spirit.
- The buffalo represents caring for family and all indigenous Nations who have been resilient and rebounded from being driven from known ways of life.
- The symbol above the poplar tree represents the North Star, the guiding star. As people we are called to be North Stars guiding others into living in balance.
- The background colours are in a blanket pattern. The orange represents Truth and Reconciliation, and the blue represents water and air which need to be protected and not polluted.
- The thirteen feathers represent the thirteen moon cycles in the year, which is the calendar the Tsuut'ina people follow. We live in balance when we are working to care for one another and for the earth all the days of the year.
- The seven teepees across the top represent the seven Nations of Treaty 7.

"My artwork is showing people of the earth coming together in prayer and peace."

Minister Resource Committee Update

The Minister Resource Committee exists to support Grace's Ministers as they lead Grace's congregation to fulfill its agreed upon mission. When there are times of transition, the Minister Resource Committee works to ensure Grace has strong ministerial resources to meet the congregation's spiritual needs.

We all know that Grace has seen many transitions in the past few years, and 2023 will be no different:

First, we are excited to welcome back the Rev. Maren McLean Persaud, Associate Minister Children and Youth on Sunday, April 2 after being on parental leave. She is returning to her 0.75 role encompassing work with children and youth, supporting the Spiritual Growth Committee, and preaching as often as once a month. Rev. Maren plans to be at Grace on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays and is looking forward to reconnecting.

Second, the Rev. Sabino Diok will continue preaching once a month. We are grateful and see his faithfulness to God's call as a wonderful example of what it means to be a disciple.

Third, the Rev. Jake Van Pernis Associate Minister, Engagement and Service and his wife Kate are expecting a baby in early July. Congratulations!

Rev. Jake will take the standard 35 weeks of parental leave, returning in the Spring of 2024. In preparation for his absence, Minister Resource is meeting with the Engagement and Service Committee to better understand their needs during this time.

We are also meeting with Kate to ensure a smooth transition for Rev. Maren's return.

Finally, the Minister Resource Committee is seeking possible full-time ministers who may be willing to support the congregation until Rev. Jake returns, as well as considering part-time leaders who would cover specific areas that correspond to our ministry model including preaching and Bible studies (like the Rev. Dr. Stephen Ferris did), pastoral care (as the Rev. Christian Persaud is doing) as well as our outreach ministries (as the Rev. Roberto DeSandoli did prior to his graduation).

Minister Resource is listening carefully for the lead of the Holy Spirit, as well as following the guidance of the Rev. Greg Smith, Grace's Interim Moderator, and Session, in working to fulfill its responsibilities.

As more decisions are made, the congregation will be informed in a timely fashion.



Also, Rob recently constructed a desk to house the live-streaming video equipment up in the balcony. A plaque dedicating the desk to God's glory has been installed on its front.



As I begin to study this text, the motion we are in as a human species came to mind. God calls Abram. She tasks him with



How did Abram begin again? He was wealthy. He was called, not forced. He traveled with his entourage. In this image, the globe subtly depicts the route the Abram and his wives, his children, his servants, and his animals took. The lines of countries are suggested as they ripple outward. Tools for navigation used to read the stars and the shadows are echoed below the globe. Stars in the corners represent the twelve tribes of Israel.

How do we begin again? Through the paper lace, the book of Genesis overlays a canvas. The text is hard to read, clouded by oil paint. How do we begin again? Listen through the haze, through the clouded reality, for God's call. God is calling as we begin again.
