

Music Notes—Second Sunday of Easter

Today's unofficial tune (at least at our service this morning) is *O filii et filiae*. It is an ancient Christian tune for Easter, attributed to the Franciscan monk, Jean Tisserand (d. 1497).

How blest are they who have not seen and yet whose faith has constant been, for they eternal life shall win. Alleluia!



The tune was very popular in medieval France, and from there has spread to other countries. The 19th-century volume *The Liturgical Year* entitles it *The Joyful Canticle* and gives Latin text with English prose translation, with a triple *Alleluia* preceding and following the hymn. In certain hymnals, however, this triple *Alleluia* is sung also between the stanzas. In others, greater particularity is indicated in the distribution of the stanzas and of the *Alleluias* which has a great effect. In the words of John Mason Neale, "It is scarcely possible for anyone, not acquainted with the melody, to imagine the jubilant effect of the triumphant *Alleluia* attached to apparently less important circumstances of the Resurrection. It seems to speak of the majesty of that event, the smallest portions of which are worthy to be so chronicled."

Today's anthem and opening hymn use this tune as well as our postlude, a clever set of variations on the theme by the American organist Wilbur Head (1914-2015). See if you can pick out the tune as it goes through all the different textures and moods created by the composer. How do these treatments affect the tune? Do they make it more mystical, perhaps jubilant or triumphant? What do you think?

Minister Resources Committee Update


