Music Notes—Fifth Sunday of Easter

This week's music notes invite us to consider our responses to music in worship.

Sometimes there has been applause following anthems in worship. At times applause or clapping can enhance worship and praise, and at other times applause or clapping may make parts of worship feel more like a performance.

Applause is a way we show appreciation as well as acknowledge skill and hard work, however, as a congregation we need to think about how we show appreciation and acknowledgement as we hold space to praise and worship together.



It is important to recognize applause can, at times, be disjointed in holding space for worshipping God for the simple reason praise should be directed to God even though we appreciate the skill and talent of people who are helping to create this space.

Music is an important part of worship, and it is wonderful that music is so appreciated in our congregation. Please know that everyone who participates in the music ministries of Grace works to help create meaningful spaces in our collective worship, and we are happy that the music ministries add meaning to people's worship experience. We deeply appreciate your support!

Going forward, here are a few ways to show appreciation other than applause if the music in worship is stirring or meaningful:

- A simple statement of "Amen" following the music.
- Thank a member of the choir or one of the musicians for the music following worship and share why it was moving or special. Comments like that are always appreciated and thanks to many who already share thanks for the music in Grace's worship.
- Emails are also a great way to share appreciation for the music. Emails that have been received have been shared with people who make up Grace's music ministry. Words of appreciation and support are greatly appreciated.

Geoffrey has specialized in pastoral care and given his on-going hospital coordinator commitment, will be serving slightly less than full-time. He is very keen to support the Deacon program. Both Rev. Wendy and Rev. Geoffrey are lovers of choral music. It is hoped that they will be introduced to the congregation in June. Rev. Dr. Geoffrey Simmins is an ordained minister of Word, Sacrament, and Pastoral Care. He has a particular interest in pastoral care and enjoys team ministry.

Recent ministry highlights include having served from 2020 to the present as the Interim Pastoral Care Minister at St. Andrew's Presbyterian, Calgary. In 2019, he served as a Minister of Worship and Pastoral Care for a Methodist-Presbyterian parish in New Zealand/Aotearoa. For the United Church, in addition to working in congregational ministry, he serves as the Hospital Ministry Coordinator for the Chinook Region. He developed an orientation program for hospital visitors.

Before entering ministry, he enjoyed a 25-year career as a professor, researcher, and administrator at the University of Calgary. He is a professor emeritus of art and architectural history.

Geoffrey is married to Joan. They are the parents of two grown sons. They are also the besotted grandparents of Ayla, who will be two this June. He looks forward to serving in team ministry with Wendy Adams and with the members and adherents at Grace.



Rev. Wendy Adams was ordained as an Elder in Grace Church, Calgary, in 1997. She served as Representative Elder to the Presbytery of Calgary-MacLeod from 1999-2004. Wendy was ordained to Ministry of Word and Sacrament in 2007 and called to St. Andrew's church in Armstrong, British Columbia where she served until 2015. She was elected Moderator of the Synod of British Columbia in 2011. In 2017 Wendy was appointed as the Minister of Children and Families at All Saints Anglican Church in Vernon where she oversaw the Sunday School and Messy Church program and assisted with a local refugee family. Wendy also has extensive experience as a leader of Spiritual Retreats and is a certified Spiritual Director.

Wendy Adams is a committed advocate for justice and has served on several Not-For-Profit Boards and Committees in that regard. In the 1990s she was the Vice-President of the Board of Directors for the Alberta Wilderness Association, as well as the editor of their news Journal. Wendy served on the International Affairs Committee of General Assembly for 6 years, 3 years as Convenor. Her primary focus was on peace and justice for citizens of Israel Palestine, and the intersection of this issue with the rights of First Nation's people in Canada. Wendy also served as President and director for the Restorative Justice Society of the North Okanagan.

Prior to her Ministry vocation, Wendy worked as a Land Secretary in the Calgary oil industry and then received a Bachelor of Arts Degree First Class Honours, Communications Major, (University of Calgary) 1995. She has been married to her husband Greg for 33 years and they enjoy their role as Great-Aunt and Great-Uncle to their niece's growing family.
