Music Notes Matt Kallio

Our prelude today takes three short pieces from the influential Italian composer Girolamo Frescobaldi's (1583-1643) work *Fiori Musicali* (translation: 'Musical Flowers'). The work is a collection of liturgical organ music first published in 1635. It contains three organ masses and two secular capriccios. Generally acknowledged as one of Frescobaldi's greatest works, *Fiori Musicali* influenced composers over at least two centuries. Johann Sebastian Bach was among its admirers, and parts of it were included in the celebrated *Gradus ad parnassum*, a highly influential 1725 treatise on counterpoint by Johann Joseph Fux which is in use even today.

Our postlude is a work by another Italian composer of the baroque era. Dominico Zipoli (1688-1726), was born in Prato, Italy and received his training from luminaries such as Bernado Pasquini in Rome and Alessandro Scarlatti in Naples. He became a Jesuit priest and travelled to South America (then part of the Spanish Empire) to live and work. His music is typical baroque style music, florid and attractive and very contrapuntal. Today's toccata is from his most famous work, the *Sonate d'intavolatura per organo e cimbalo* (published in 1716).







Truth and Reconciliation: Calls to Action

The Presbyterian Church in Canada has endorsed the Calls to Action published by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. The Truth, Healing & Reconcili-Action Team at Grace shares the following Call to Action and prayer as a way to engage in this important work.

Call 27:

We call upon the Federation of Law Societies of Canada to ensure that lawyers receive appropriate cultural competency training, which includes the history and legacy of residential schools, the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, Treaties and Aboriginal rights, Indigenous law, and Aboriginal—Crown relations.

Prayer:

God of justice, shine a light on Indigenous legal traditions and the treaties. We pray for lawmakers, law enforcers, lawyers and arbiters. Remind us that treaties are sacred agreements for sharing resources and living together on the land you created.

Let us work for reconciliation. Amen

Grace's Interim Moderator

The Presbytery of Calgary-Macleod has named the Rev. Dr. Jean Morris as Grace's Interim Moderator effective June 1 following the resignation of the Rev. Greg Smith. As the Interim Moderator, Jean has specific Terms of Reference, with two primary areas of responsibility. The first is to work with the Search Committee in the recruitment of a minister, and the second is to be the Moderator of Grace's Session. She will also be supporting the Revs. Adams and Simmins who will be providing leadership in ministry to the congregation for the next year.

We give thanks to God for Jean's willingness to serve as Grace's Interim Moderator.

Session Highlights:

At its regular meeting on June 12, the Session:

- was moderated by the new Interim Moderator, Jean Morris
- opened with a reading of Psalm 90 and prayer
- shared enthusiasms and concerns relating to life and work at Grace
- observed the strong engagement of the children and youth with the PWS&D
 Opening Classroom Doors initiative, noted the recent data showing the number
 of South Sudanese and Eritrean refugees arriving in Calgary and their challenges,
 and remembered the recent provincial election and our prayers for all the MLA's
- expressed its gratitude for the willingness to serve of the new interim moderator and the pro tem ministers
- agreed to take next steps to solicit further input and to explore a proposed revised ministry model
- received an update from the Lead Minister Search Committee which continues its outreach to potential candidates
- approved the purpose and principles for the Enduring Grace Legacy Fund and the development of a draft agreement for professional investment management
- supported the engagement of the congregation in raising funds (~\$60,000) to restore 9 stained glass windows in the sanctuary
- received updates on the programs supporting faith formation of adults and children and youth
- was reminded of the upcoming leadership retreat on June 23 and 24
- noted that Grace's YouTube channel now has 194 subscribers
- was advised of Presbytery's plans for its regular visitation at Grace this fall
- agreed to jointly study the book *How to Lead When You Don't Know Where You're Going* by Susan Beaumont, starting in September
- expressed its hopes and prayers as Rev. Jake begins his leave in the next month
- closed with prayer and a benediction
