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Music Notes

Happy Canada Day! This morning we sing our national anthem, music by Calixa Lavalee (December 28, 1842-January 21, 1891). Lavalee best known for writing "O Canada" was born into a musical family and studied organ with his bandleader father Augustin Lavallee. He worked as a musician in the United States until the outbreak of the American Civil War at which point, he enlisted as a Private and musician in the 4th Rhode Island Infantry Regimental Band. After the war, he travelled extensively in the U.S. and Europe organizing concerts and teaching. He was commissioned to write our national anthem on St. Jean Baptiste day, 1880 by the Lieutenant Governor of Quebec, Theodor Robitalle.

Our prelude today by German baroque composer Johann Walther is a beautifully written chorale prelude based on the tune "Ach Gott und Herr" (Ah, my Lord and God). In it, notice how Walther skillfully arranges the tunes (cantus firmus) in canon between the solo stop manual and the pedals. To close the service, we have a "Trompette" or trumpet tune by the English, classical composer John Stanley. A trumpet tune is an organ piece that imitates idiomatically the properties of the trumpet while not necessarily needing an actual trumpet. Usually, this means an abundance of florid passage work or dotted rhythms in the music. This trompette also has a commonly used echo effect in which the organist will play a louder section on one manual (keyboard) and a softer echo effect on another manual.





Truth and Reconciliation: Calls to Action

The Presbyterian Church in Canada has endorsed the Calls to Action published by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. The Truth, Healing & Reconcili-Action Team at Grace shares the following Call to Action and prayer as a way to engage in this important work.

Call 59:

We call upon churches to develop ongoing education strategies to ensure that their respective congregations learn about their church's role in colonization and in residential schools, and why apologies are necessary.

Prayer:

God of reason and understanding, we love to talk about theology, but sometimes our talk leads to actions of violence, not love. Sometimes our practices divide rather than reconcile. Lead us to face the truth of the past and to work for peace in the future. Remind us that confession from the heart leads to healing of the heart; that words of truth build trust. Stir us to respond to your longing for a new creation to heal and restore the circle of your people. Let us work for reconciliation. Amen
