Music Notes

Good morning and welcome to Grace Presbyterian! Today's service is chock full of music, including a Fantasia from the Fitzwilliam Virginal Book by William Byrd, a Sonata by German composer George Philip Telemann and an aria from Felix Mendelssohn's famous oratorio *Elijah*.

The keyboard works of the early baroque/late renaissance are often labelled as pieces for the precursor of harpsichord, the virginal, a smaller, square shaped keyboard instrument ideal for home music making. As such, the *Fantasia* played today is sourced from the *Fitzwilliam Virginal Book*, a collection of early keyboard music, bequeathed by the Viscount Fitzwilliam in 1816. A veritable who's who of major early English composers were collected in this invaluable manuscript, including William Byrd, Orlando Gibbons, John Bull, Giles Farnaby, Thomas Tallis as well as the Dutch composer Jan Peeter Sweelinck.

Our offertory is a selection from *Elijah*, the well-known oratorio by Felix Mendelssohn depicting events in the life of the Prophet Elijah as told in the books 1 Kings and 2 Kings of the Old Testament. It premiered on 26 August 1846. The aria takes its text from Isaiah 54:10 and is sung by Elijah himself: "For the mountains may depart and the hills be removed, but my steadfast love shall not depart from you, and my covenant of peace shall not be removed, says the LORD, who has compassion on you."

Peacemaking

"Christ, the Prince of Peace, calls his followers to seek peace in the world. Sometimes war may be unavoidable but that the tragic evil that comes with war must rouse us work for peace" (Living Faith 8.5.1-2). The church has a statement on the Theology of Peacemaking and supports the concept of the Responsibility to



Protect. The church has advocated that Canada support UN Conventions to regulate the trade of conventional weapons and to ban nuclear weapons and land mines.

Principles that the General Assembly of The Presbyterian Church in Canada has endorsed:

- There can be no peace without justice. God's peace cannot be separated from God's righteousness, justice and steadfast love.
- Christians are called to be active participants in the process of peace-making.
- As a witness to God's reign the church must address the well-organized roots of violence, deal with the world powers-that-be that bear a special responsibility for all aspects of social justice and seek out people of good will who are working for the cause of peace and need well-organized support.
- Canada should maintain a peacekeeping role in international affairs and focus attention on seeking the welfare of all people on earth as a way of achieving world peace.
- A military solution in itself is no solution to international conflict.
- The PCC endorses the Canadian Council of Churches document "The Canadian Churches and the Responsibility to Protect" while recognizing the questions addressed concerning the use of last resort (military intervention) and the potential for abuse of the Responsibility to Protect doctrine.
- Economic advocacy is a non-violent action that may contribute to peaceful change.
- Ethnic or cultural distinctions must enrich the church not divide it. The church must condemn idolatrous nationalism in its many forms and be an effective witness of God's kingdom of shalom.
