Music Notes

Good morning, Grace Presbyterian!

Today's music includes two beautiful baroque gems and one modern, based on baroque style. Our prelude is a chorale partita by Georg Bohm. His work was highly influential to other German organists at the time including Johann Sebastian Bach, who greatly admired the older musician's style. Besides his inventive preludes and fugues, Bohm is particularly known for his development of the chorale partita, a form he is credited with inventing. It combines the German chorale prelude with the Italian variation canzona to create a multimovement work that takes a hymn tune (chorale) as its theme



and variates on it in clever ways. Today's chorale partita uses the tune *Wer nur den lieben Gott lasst walten* (translation: He who allows dear God to rule him).

Our offertory *Variations on Lobe den Herren* is subtitled *homage to Pachelbel*. Here, American organist Christa Rakich creates some lovely variations based on our opening hymn tune *Lobe den Herren* (Praise to the Lord, the Almighty). Rakich is a brilliant organist, having performed extensively throughout North America and Europe as well as holding positions as organist at Westminster Choir College, University of Connecticut as well as Harvard University. In today's variations she cleverly uses idioms from Johann Pachelbel's style to good effect.

Finally, we finish with an actual piece by Pachelbel, his *Toccata in g minor*. The etymology of the word toccata comes from the Italian *toccare*, meaning "to touch". The toccata evolved from an improvised piece that allowed the player to try out (or "to touch") the instrument. Usually this involved some fast figurations and scale work to test the mettle of the instrument in question. Thus, the toccata morphed into a brilliant, grand piece with an improvisatory flair.

Minister Resource Update

The Rev. Wendy Adams started her term June 23, 2023and will complete her time at Grace March 16, 2024.

The Rev. Dr. Geoffrey Simmins will start September 1, 2023 and continue at Grace until June 30, 2024.

The Rev. Jake Van Pernis is scheduled to return to work March 17, 2024. From that time until June 30, he and The Rev. Simmins will work together to complete ministerial responsibilities.

The Rev. Dr. Jean Morris began June 1, 2023 as Interim Moderator. Her responsibilities are primarily to Moderate the Session, work with the Search Committee, oversee the work of the Interim Ministers, ensure a ministry plan is in place and the pulpit is filled.

2023 – 2024 Ministry Expectations and Responsibilities

The expectations for this interim ministry shall be to encourage the congregation to move forward and live into its mission. It is further expected that the two Interim Ministers will work collaboratively when their respective terms of service overlap, to fulfill the responsibilities outlined below.

General Responsibilities include:

- \cdot preaching and worship planning with the Music Coordinator three times/month
- · welcome and worship planning with any Visiting Ministers
- \cdot celebrating the sacraments
- \cdot conducting weddings and officiating at funerals
- · resourcing the Spiritual Growth Committee
- \cdot conducting and providing oversight of Bible and book studies
- \cdot oversight of the Music Coordinator and the Nursery Supervisor
- · provide emergency pastoral care

Both Ministers will be required to:

- \cdot develop a work plan to fulfill said responsibilities
- \cdot provide monthly reports to Session
- \cdot attend meetings of the Minister Resource Committee
- \cdot communicate with the Interim Moderator
- work collegially with the Support Services Director to ensure integration of ministry and staff work undergirded by effective operational management and a positive staff culture
- \cdot fulfil other tasks as assigned by Session

The Rev. Adams will be required to:

- \cdot resource the Youth and Sunday School Team
- · resource the Engagement & Service Committee
- · attend regular and emergent meetings of Session
- \cdot provide a report at the end of the interim ministry agreement

The Rev. Simmins will be required to:

- · provide pastoral care
- \cdot resource the Pastoral Care Committee including expanding the Deacon program
- \cdot resource Preaching Grace
- \cdot teach about the contemplative tradition generally and Christian meditation specifically
- \cdot provide a report at the end of the interim ministry agreement

Stained Glass Window Restoration Project

Thursday, July 27 marked the 110th anniversary of the dedication of Grace Presbyterian Church. To mark this significant milestone, the Stewardship

Committee, with the support of Session, initiated a campaign to engage the congregation in the repair and restoration of nine stained glass windows that were identified as requiring urgent restoration and preservation. In total, there are fiftythree individual stained glass windows throughout the church. The Project was launched on July 1, and on Sunday, August 20, we exceeded our goal of \$60,000. Our sincere thanks to the generous donors who supported this project.

Over the next several months, Rubaiyat Stained Glass Studio will be repairing and restoring the nine stained-glass windows, one at a time. Any excess donations will be held in trust for future stained glass window restorations.


Mission Moment





In Malawi, Alifonsina Banda, a 26-year-old mother, took part in vocational skills training through the PWS&D-supported *Every Girl Empowered* project. Despite the long-standing perception in her community that electronics courses are not for girls, Alifonsina challenged herself and enrolled in the electronics course. Since completing the class, she has repaired phones, installed satellite dishes, and worked as an electrician, earning a sustainable income from her business. "After the course, I had the most wonderful festive season in my life. I may not be able to remember how much money I made, but I had a client almost every day," she shares. In the future, Alifonsina plans to open an electronics shop to sell spare parts and is thankful that the *Every Girl Empowered* project has given her a lifelong opportunity to improve the financial opportunities for herself and her family.
