

of a new organ in 1773.

Today is Reign of Christ Sunday, the last Sunday before we move into the season of Advent. In honour of this, we have chosen some great music. Darwell's 148, better known as "Rejoice the Lord is King" reflects this theme particularly well.

John Darwell, the writer of this hymn, was born in the village of Haughton in Staffordshire, England and educated at Manchester Grammar School and Brasenose College, Oxford (which he entered at the age of 14). Graduating in 1756 Darwell became curate and later vicar of St Matthew's Parish in Walsall, in the West Midlands. In 1766 he married his second wife Mary Whateley, a published poet who ran a printing press and also wrote hymns. He died on December 18, 1789 at Walsall and was buried at the Bath Street Burial Grounds.

Darwall is best known for his setting of Psalm 148, known as DARWALL'S 148th, which is most often sung to the words "Rejoice the Lord is King" (from Charles Wesley's Moral and Sacred Poems of 1744) and to "Ye holy angels bright" (from Richard Baxter's Poetical Fragments of 1681). It was first sung at the inauguration

Elder Nominations

As part of our ongoing leadership development at Grace, every two years we recruit new Elders to serve the congregation. Election to the eldership is the call of God, through the congregation, for service in Christ's Church. Since the eldership is a spiritual office concerned with the rule and pastoral oversight of the congregation, only suitable people should be considered. They should be committed Christians, in regular attendance at public worship, persons of sound judgment and upright character, and either knowledgeable or prepared to learn of the government of the church. The right of electing elders is vested in the professing members of the congregation. (*Book of Forms* 132.)

This is how members of Grace can participate in the process of choosing new Ruling Elders (this process follows the guidelines set out in The Presbyterian Church in Canada's *Book of Forms*):

- Pray for potential new Elders.
- Exercise discernment about nominating a member of Grace to this office.
- Find another member to submit a nomination of a potential new Elder. New Elders must be nominated by two members of the congregation.

- Nominations will be accepted until Monday, December 4, 2023.

Once the nomination period has ended, Rev. Wendy will interview the nominees to gauge their interest moving forward. The nominees will then meet with the Ad Hoc Nomination Committee to explore their sense of calling.

The list of those who feel called will be reviewed by the current Session Elders and then will be voted on by members at a congregational meeting in April of 2024.

Subsequent to their election, there will be a service of ordination.

Session Highlights

At its regular meeting on November 13, the Session:

- reflected on the Spirit's letters to the angels of the seven churches described in Revelation, imagining how we might describe the characteristics of the angel of the church at Grace
- continued its review of Susan Beaumont's book How to Lead When You Don't Know Where You're Going, focusing on Chapter 3, which encourages leaders to tend the soul of the organization, eliminating the false divide between organizational leadership and spiritual leadership
- gave thanks for the community connection through Trunk N Treat, the beauty of the Remembrance Day concert, and the music in the Church School and prayed for healing for members facing serious diagnoses
- discussed reports of the exit interviews of the Rev. Christian Persaud and the Rev. Maren McLean Persaud. Some of the recommended follow-ups are already being actioned while a small group will identify other potential learnings and recommendations for the Session's consideration
- requested the Rev. Wendy Adams to recommend modifications to the position description for the Support Services Director, with Alan Facey, and to recommend the associated staffing structure
- discussed the year-to-date 2023 financial results and the latest draft of the 2024 budget with the Treasurer. Adjustments to reduce the size of the deficit will be incorporated in the version that is presented to the congregation for consideration on December 10
- was updated on discussions with RESET Society who have advised that Grace House no longer meets their needs. The congregation will be asked to approve the sale of Grace House at the upcoming congregational meeting
- received updated Terms of Reference for the Committees, reflecting the recent adjustments to the Strategic Plan. These Terms of Reference documents will be considered at a future meeting. A \$2000 contract was approved to develop a workable model for leadership development at Grace, before establishing a Leadership Development Committee.
- approved the Terms of Reference for the Ad Hoc Land, Facilities and Assets
 Committee. This Committee is to review all current land holdings, facilities reports
 and financial investments/assets from which the Session will develop strategies
 aligning with the mission, vision and values
- received reports from the standing Committees, plus the Search and Ad Hoc Elder Election Committees, the Interim Ministers, the Interim Moderator, Support Services Director, Communications Specialist and Co-Ordinator of Volunteers.

Session Highlights cont'd

- decided against proceeding with a proposal to share Grace's building with Our Saviour Anglican Church
- recognized the large number of initiatives underway and gave thanks for the faithful work of so many, and
- closed with prayer and benediction.

Mission Moment



Cyclone Freddy—one of the most powerful storms ever recorded in the southern hemisphere—made landfall in Malawi in March 2023. Thousands in Malawi were left homeless, and with severe crop losses, over 345,000 people were affected by the heavy rains, floods and landslides. Through its partners, PWS&D responded to this devastating disaster by providing maize flour and soya to enable families to meet their immediate food requirements. Additionally, because of critical food insecurity due to droughts and floods in the area, PWS&D implemented a three-month food assistance project for 2,500 households. This project provided food assistance in the form of cash transfers, as well as seeds to produce high-value crops.
