

Music Notes

Announcing this first Sunday of Advent, our prelude is a German advent tune "Gotts Sohn ist kommen" (God's Son is coming) from Johann Walter's collection of chorale preludes. A cousin of the famous Johann Sebastian Bach, Walther studied organ and composition with members of the Bach family. He was an influential and noted musician of the northern baroque school.

Service concludes today with the well-known Swedish tune "Bereden vag for Herran", commonly known to us as "Prepare the Way O Zion". Offertory music is a setting of Psalm 80 by the English classical era composer Thomas Clarke. It comes from the "Eighth Set of Psalm Tunes" published in London circa 1830 with text by Issac Watts.

Finally, I am excited to welcome the newly formed Grace Camarata to our worship service today. This group of enthusiastic amateur and professional instrumentalists, is keen to lend its time and talents to enhancing our service music, and they have a lot of fun doing it! Christmas Luncheon for Clients of the Alex

With a full complement of health, housing, and community programs, The Alex is a hub of supports and outreach services for people who are experiencing poverty, trauma, social isolation, and/or health challenges including addiction. On December 14, the Alex will host a Christmas luncheon here at Grace. Grace volunteers are invited to help welcome Alex guests and to prepare and serve the meal. This is a meaningful opportunity for Grace to connect further with our community, sharing hospitality as followers of Christ.

Session Committee Members

Ministries, programs and projects at Grace are overseen by committees of Session. These committees are served by members and adherents, not just elders, of the congregation who have interest in the ministry of a particular committee and are able to meet typically once per month, by Zoom or in-person. There is a regular rotation of membership and there are currently opportunities for service and impact in a number of these committees.

English Language Learner Program Coordinator

Grace has had an English Language Learner (ELL) program operating for more than 10 years — it has touched the lives of hundreds of individuals practising their conversational English in a safe, supportive environment. Currently, classes are offered Monday mornings through the school year. The program is running very smoothly, with dedicated and capable class teachers in place. The Coordinator role is about supporting these volunteer class leaders with the resources they need, trouble-shooting and visioning how to make this program even better.


God's Grace in Scripture is offered in the Lounge from 9:30 to 10:30 am, followed by a fellowship time. Drop in any week.

Humanitarian Crisis in Gaza

As Palestine and Israel are mired in violence and suffering, PWS&D is prepared to respond to the humanitarian needs. The ongoing hostilities have created a humanitarian crisis, with homes, schools, medical facilities and crucial infrastructure having been extensively damaged or destroyed. The conflict has led to a significant mass displacement—1.4 million out of Gaza's 2.2 million residents are currently displaced. The Presbyterian Church in Canada (PCC) stands in solidarity with all the people of the region, who are enduring the devastating consequences of continued violence and strife. With the church leaders in the area, the PCC condemns all acts that target civilians, regardless of nationality, ethnicity, or faith.

PWS&D supports peacebuilding efforts in Israel/Palestine through KAIROS' <u>Women of Courage</u> program. PWS&D's humanitarian response will assist with shelter, food, livelihoods, emergency health, psychosocial and mental health support, as well as cash assistance to allow people to purchase the goods they require.
