Music Notes:

Merry Christmas Grace Church! Since we are in the season of Christmas, it's a great opportunity for musicians to play their favorite music based on carols. Kicking us off this morning is our own Colleen Charter playing a beautiful arrangement of the French carol "Cantique de Noel" commonly known in the English-speaking world as "O Holy Night". In Roquemaure, France, at the end of 1843, the town's church organ had recently been renovated. To celebrate the event, the parish priest persuaded poet Placide Cappeau, a native of the town, to write a Christmas poem. Cappeau's original poem began with the line, "Minuit, Chrétien, c'est l'heure solennelle" (Midnight, Christian, is the solemn hour). Soon afterwards, in that same year, Adolphe Adam composed the music. The song was premiered in Roquemaure in 1847 by the opera singer Emily Laurey.

Our postlude today uses the familiar tune "Antioch", known the world over as "Joy to the World". In this arrangement, the tune is cleverly woven into a 6/8 meter by American composer Hugo Gehrke. A devout Lutheran, Gehrke came from a musical family, and became a noted organist at Concordia Lutheran College in Chicago where he also taught third, fourth and fifth grades. His career as a musician spanned decades and involved directing choirs such as the Milwaukee a cappella Lutheran Choir as well as several prominent positions as organist within the American Lutheran community.


Volunteer Opportunities

- considered the status of police background checks as required by the Leading with Care policy and identified necessary steps
- received reports from the committees and staff on the progress in their workplans, and gave thanks to God for the faithful work of so many people
- referred various correspondence as appropriate for follow-up
- closed with prayers of thanksgiving and intercession and a benediction


