

Music Notes:

Good morning, Grace Presbyterian, I hope your Christmas was restful and joyous. Here we are at Epiphany Sunday and we have some great music that reflects this day.

Our prelude today is J.S. Bach's beautiful, and very unusual chorale prelude "Wie schön leuchtet der Morgenstern," which translates to "how brightly shines the morning star," the star being a reference to Jesus. With the themes of stars and light in Epiphany, it is a great choice for this Sunday. In this work, Bach takes the tune of the chorale and develops it throughout the piece, first in the soprano voice and then in the pedals (bass voice). This is the very first chorale prelude to survive in Bach's opus and it is a very youthful work. He was evidently quite proud of it as he kept it meticulously in his catalogue of works throughout his life. The piece is unusual in the sense that there are little virtuosic departures, almost like the young Bach was trying to "show off" a little. These departures sometimes do not have much to do with the core material, an unusual aspect that the mature Bach would likely not have done. A further theory for these departures is that he wrote this as a tribute and showpiece for the older composer Dietrich Buxtehude, whom he admired and looked up to. It certainly has a few Buxtehudian flourishes in it in the manner of the stylus fantasticus (a free-form style that has improvisatory contrasting sections believed to have started with the Italian organist Claudio Merulo). On a personal note, when playing this, I tend to notice that some of the figurations with the appropriate registrations begin to elicit stars twinkling in the sky and create an optimistic, hopeful feeling. I wonder if this was done intentionally? Knowing this composer, it likely was.


Volunteer Opportunities


