Exploring the Traditions of Christian Contemplation and Meditation

Christians meditate. Is that news to you? It is to many people. Yes, some Christians meditate. And so can you. You are invited to learn about the Christian contemplative tradition in a four-part series on Christian Contemplation and Meditation. The study will consist of four sessions each approximately an hour in length. Pastries and beverage service are planned to be a part of each session.

Participants will gain an overview of the main traditions of Christian meditation, using the teaching and practices established by the Benedictine monk John Main as our principal reference. We will explore Centering Prayer and other contemplative teachings and practices.

Each session will include a time for practicing meditation and for discussion afterwards. At the end of the study, participants will have learned about how, when, and why Christians meditate —and will be equipped to put meditation into their own spiritual journey.

Katia Bien-Aime, a senior nurse and coordinator for a nutrition program in Haiti, recalls a time when a significant number of children failed to return for follow-up care after initial treatment at the nutrition clinic. She knew something needed to be done. In response, PWS&D's partner, who also runs the original clinic, decided to begin mobile clinics. Today, these mobile units have proven successful in bridging the gap and allowing healthcare providers to get closer to their patients, easier follow-ups and enabling the delivery of crucial basic medical care directly to villages and homes. "It worked," Katia says. "We were able to get to the really sick kids faster and earlier." In addition, the mobile units provide tools to make water safe for drinking and to promote better sanitation and hygiene practices.

Mission Moments highlight the ministry the Presbyterian Church in Canada is doing through Presbyterian World Service & Development (PWS&D). For over 75 years, PWS&D has been working with partners overseas and with Canadians across the country to make positive changes in the world.
