Today's anthem arranged by Mark Schweitzer is a beautifully tender take on an old Shaker tune from Kentucky. The words "Love is little, love is low, love will make our spirits grow. Grow in peace, grow in light; love will do the thing that's right" are particularly poignant for the celebration of baptism.

"All'Elevazione" translated means "to the elevation," which probably meant this piece was to be used as a liturgical piece for communion when the bread and wine are presented. Zipoli, who composed this piece was a Jesuit missionary, who studied in Rome before travelling to, and working in South America. His choral works and organ works were widely and regularly performed in his day, but have fallen into obscurity today. His works are well-written and attractive additions to an organ repertoire.



When Madalitso's mother fell seriously ill and had to give up her job, they moved in with family for support. At first, Madalitso's grandma's beer brewing venture was thriving and played a crucial role in supporting her primary school education. However, Madalitso's grandmother eventually had to stop this business, and the family could not longer afford to send Madalitso to school. With help from PWS&D, the Blantyre Synod Education Department's Neno scholarship program allowed Madalitso to re-enroll, enabling her to dream of a brighter future.
