She has her MDiv from Ambrose University and a Master's Certificate in Presbyterian Studies from Vancouver School of Theology. Chandra, as a Candidate for Ministry in The Presbyterian Church in Canada, has recently preached for the call at St. Giles Presbyterian Church in Calgary, which is working in partnership with Calgary Korean Presbyterian Church to support its English ministry.

Chandra has a keen interest in reconciliation efforts in Canada, and for the past several years she has been working on The Manitou Project, an Indigenous Reconciliation Project in Alberta, where she is learning from the wisdom shared by Elders and Spiritual Leaders of the First Peoples of Canada. In her work with St. Giles Presbyterian Church and Calgary Korean Presbyterian Church, she is engaged in ongoing reconciling efforts with The Presbyterian Church in Canada and its Korean congregations. Chandra is appreciative of the transformational journey Grace has walked in its own reconciliation efforts.

This choir is **completely free to join and includes voice training, music theory and, of course, singing!** Our instructors are Trisha McKinney, early childhood specialist and voice teacher and Matthew Kallio, music coordinator, Grace Presbyterian Church. Rehearsals are at 1:00 p.m. in the Sunday school area (dining hall downstairs) at the church.

## Music Notes

The prelude is a well-known piece by J.S. Bach titled "Schafe können sicher weiden" from the Cantata "Was mir behagt ist nur die muntre Jagd" BWV 208, arranged for organ and piano by Herbert Colvin and features our guest musician Helena Barker. The piece is more commonly known as "Sheep May Safely Graze". It is Bach's earliest surviving secular cantata, composed while he was employed as court organist in Weimar. The work may have been intended as a 31 birthday gift from Bach's employer, William Ernst, Duke of Saxe-Weimar, for his neighbouring ruler, Duke Christian, who was a keen hunter. With Psalm 23 in the service this morning, it seemed like an appropriate pastoral choice.

The anthem "All Things Bright and Beautiful" is a perennial favourite by English composer John Rutter (b. 1945). The music is melodic and lyrical. The words of the anthem ties into the theme of Care of Creation starting with "*All things bright and beautiful, all creatures great and small. All things wise and wonderful, the Lord God made them all.*"

### **Session Highlights**

On April 8, 2024, the Session:

- Opened with a reading of Isaiah 43:18-20, prayer and reflection on what is emerging at Grace.
- Received a presentation from Treasurer Rob McDonald regarding the 2023 financial results and agreed that the statements would be provided to the congregation for consideration at the May 5 congregational meeting. First Quarter 2024 results and contribution trends were also discussed.
- Agreed that a review by a professional third-party firm of the 2024 and subsequent Financial Statements would be arranged, for transparency, diligence and protection of the Treasurer.
- Agreed with proposed changes to the list of Committee Conveners, subject to finalization after the May 5 election of elders.
- Approved two studies to be held Sunday mornings before worship, the first on Christian Contemplation and Meditation, and the second on the book *The Lemon Tree*, and supported creative approaches to the worship service on Pentecost, May 19.
- Agreed in concept with a proposed music ministry model built around two key roles - Accompanist and Music Director - subject to further definition of position terms.
- Received a report reviewing pastoral care and maintenance of the Roll at Grace, and approved several recommendations, including:
  - ◊ the establishment of a volunteer Roll Clerk, with details of the position description to be finalized, to help Session maintain an accurate roll of professing members, adherents and children.
  - ◊ the creation of a Deacon of Welcome and Integration to provide more intentional welcome to newcomers, and
  - ◊ the continuation of the current Deacon program for at least the next two years.
- Supported the establishment of mentors for newly elected elders.

- Considered the trends in the evaluation by Session members of the Session's spiritual leadership, effectiveness and committees.
- Appointed Mary Lil Rozsa de Coquet to serve a one year term as Grace's Representative Elder to Presbytery.
- Received reports from Grace's Committees and Staff on their work.
- Gave thanks for the many blessings emerging at Grace and prayed for the congregation in the coming weeks, closing with a benediction.

## Presbyterian World Service and Development Mission Moment



In the Kushkak village in Afghanistan, 42-year-old Guljan lived a simple life with her husband and four children until one day in October 2023, when an earthquake struck their village. Guljan lost her husband and 11-year-old son. After the disaster, she encountered significant challenges in getting assistance due to the gender disparities present in her village. However, PWS&D's partner recognized her needs and provided Guljan's family with a winterized tent to help endure the harsh weather conditions. PWS&D provided food assistance, as well as other support after the earthquake to help people survive the winter challenges.
