A funeral service for Gail McFayden will be held in Grace's Sanctuary Tuesday, April 30 at 1:30 p.m. A reception will follow at the Calgary Golf and Country Club, (5900 Elbow Drive SW) from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m.

Music Notes

This morning's prelude is based on the hymn tune "The Solid Rock" by William Bradbury (1816-1868). Born at York, Maine, Bradbury was raised on his father's farm, with rainy days spent in a shoe shop. He loved music and spent spare hours practicing any music he could find. He became organist of Bowdoin Street Church in Boston and composed favorites such as "Jesus Loves Me" and "He Leadeth Me".

Our postlude is one of Pachelbel's wonderful toccatas. Toccata comes from the Italian word "toccare" (meaning to touch). The toccata started to become prevalent in the late Renaissance period and crystallized into a music form in the Baroque period. Since it was originally an improvised piece used to test out an unfamiliar instrument, it typically contains technically challenging passagework such as quick scale, chords, or arpeggios meant to put the instrument through its paces.

The Lemon Tree by Sandy Tolan is a poignant exploration of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict through the lens of two families connected by a single home and a lemon tree planted in its backyard. The book delves into the complex emotions and historical events that intertwine the lives of a Palestinian man, Bashir Khairi, and an Israeli woman, Dalia Eshkenazi, offering readers a deeply human perspective on the enduring conflict. It's an insightful resource for those looking to understand the nuances of Middle Eastern history, the personal stories that reflect larger communal narratives, and read about reconciliation efforts.

Pick-up your copy of *The Lemon Tree* from your favourite bookstore, used bookstore, or online retailer now to read how the stories of Dalia and Bashir, and the lemon tree are woven together and join in meaningful conversations in the Perspectives Book Study.

Prebysterian World Service and Development Mission Moment Presbyterian Sharing

The Reformed Parish in Csap/Chop, a congregation of the Reformed Church in Transcarpathia in western Ukraine, has been providing temporary shelter and food for people displaced by the war. Their social kitchen program includes hot food delivery to elderly congregation members who live alone and are unable to cook for themselves. With limited resources, Bishop Zan-Fabian reached out to the PCC for financial support to continue this ministry of care. The PCC provided a grant from Presbyterians Sharing, fulfilling the law of Christ to bear one another's burdens.
