

Music Notes

The prelude music is three short pieces. Two of the pieces are from the Baroque era; the first is written by Johann Pachelbel, the second by Johann Christian Bach (the youngest son of Johanne Sebastian Bach). The third piece is by Flor Peeters, a Belgian composer, organist and academic teacher. He was Director of the Conservatorium in Antwerp, Belgium, and organist at Mechelen Cathedral from 1923 to his death in 1986. As an organist, Peeters enjoyed great renown giving concerts and liturgical masterclasses all over the world. His works often employ very different harmonic language, for example, in the prelude piece there is an interesting chant-like effect using open interval notes to create different harmonics.

The two positions and model were proposed by the Spiritual Growth Committee and approved by Grace's Session to follow an earlier Session decision that the position of Music Director and the needs of Grace's Music Ministry would be explored when a new Lead Minister was in place. Matt Kallio, who has served as Grace's Interim Music Coordinator is aware of this search and has provided input into the position descriptions. Matt's current contract concludes at the end of January 2025, and Grace is grateful for his leadership. Matt is also eligible to apply for either position if he is interested. Wild Grace is a time of reflection and connection at Confederation Park ("Experience nature in the city" <u>https://www.calgary.ca/parks/confederation-</u>



Presbyterians Sharing



With support from Presbyterians Sharing, the Newcomers Mission has faithfully been gathering and offering services and spiritual support to newly arrived immigrants and refugees in the Peterborough area since 2016. Like the soft, protective wings of a dove, the programming of Newcomers Mission provides refuge and care for people living through very difficult and vulnerable situations. One wing of the ministry represents the spiritual side through worship services, prayer meetings and house visits. The other wing is the social and cultural side, helping newcomers to access support services, obtain employment and provide English language teaching and translation services. The two wings work together so that the newcomers can succeed and belong.
