September Worship at Grace: The Garden of God

Grace continues to explore the theme of The Garden of God in September by spending time looking at the book of James, which invites followers of Christ to grow in faith and produce the "fruits" of faith - love, justice, peace, and kindness - using simple and powerful language.

This invitation calls us into a vibrant and joyful life; what Jesus called, "abundant life." Join Grace over the next four Sundays as we explore what growth in abundant life can look like in ourselves and in our church.

Music Notes

The anthem "The Call", by American composer and conductor Z. Randell Stroop reflects the spirit of the reading of the Gospel according to Mark. The lyric reinforces Mark's words of Jesus being the Messiah; "*Come my way, my truth, my light, such a way as gives us breath, such a truth as ends all strife: such a life, such a life as killeth death*".

Today's service also includes two instances of the beautiful Irish hymn tune "SLANE", once as the offertory by Canadian composer Healey Willan, and then as our closing hymn. "SLANE" is an old Irish folk melody that became a hymn tune when it was arranged by David Evans and set to the Irish hymn "Be Thou My Vision" published in the Church Hymnary (1927).

Session Highlights

At its regular meeting on September 9, the Session:

- worshipped in the Chapel, with hymns, prayers, and reflection on Mark 8:27-38
- approved an updated Budget Monitoring policy which clarifies Committees' authority to approve expenditures not previously budgeted
- referred a proposal for an Investment Policy to the Financial Management Committee for additional consideration
- approved a position description for a Youth Ministry Leader, to be recruited this fall
- approved the position description for the Nursery Supervisor
- was updated on the Roll. There are now 350 professing members and 162 adherents who are assigned elders who visit, and provide care and connection
- received reports from the Financial Management, Engagement & Service, Land & Facilities, Minister Resource & Presbytery Relations, Spiritual Growth, and Pastoral Care & Connection Committees
- received updates from the Lead Minister, Support Services Director, and Coordinator of Volunteers
- agreed upon a revised Session calendar to increase focus on visioning and strategic planning and reduce unnecessary reporting burden on Committees
- continued discussions following the June Leadership Retreat, identifying potential initiatives, both short-term and long-term. Further discernment within the Session, broader leadership, and the congregation is planned.
- closed with the singing of the doxology.
