Jubilee: Gospel Love & Justice

The Hebrew Law provided for a year of Jubilee every 50 years. On this year all debts were to be forgiven and all prisoners set free. It was to stand as a sign of God's steadfast love and grace and a mark of God's intention that the world be free. As far as we know, Israel never initiated a Jubilee Year, but it stood in the Law as a longing and a promise. Jesus declared in Luke that the year of the Lord's favour—the Jubilee—was found in him. Through this season we will explore passages in Corinthians and Luke that lift up the shape of Jubilee—God's love and justice, God's liberation of all creation in Jesus Christ. As Grace celebrates 120 years of ministry this year, let us pray that God will make this a Jubilee for us and for our community.

Music Notes

As the season of Epiphany begins, *Wie Schon Leuchtet der Morgenstern* (How Lovely Shines the Morning Star) wonderfully illustrates the theme of Jesus being a light to all people. The text of this Lutheran hymn written by Phillip Nicolai in 1597 and first published in 1599 states:

"How beautifully shines the morning star full of grace and truth from the Lord, the sweet root of Jesse! You son of David from the line of Jacob, my king and my bridegroom, have taken possession of my heart, [you who are] lovely, friendly, beautiful and glorious, great and honorable, rich in gifts, lofty and exalted in splendor!"

The words of this hymn have inspired musical settings through centuries, including Johann Pachelbel's that is a part of today's worship. Listen for the opening statement of the hymn tune in the keyboard, and notice the augmentation of the tune in the organ pedals (bass) - a lovely counterpoint!

An Evening with Reverend Tony Snow

Join us for the 2025 Chair of Christian Thought Lebel Lecture in Christian Ethics: *Reconciliation and Repair: Treaty, Covenant, Relationship, Bond*



Christian communities engaged in the work of reconciliation seek to repair relationships and histories often neglected, buried, and considered shameful to the society at large. A retelling of this history necessitates a coming to terms with who we were then and who we are now, and all that our past has constructed to enable the enjoyment we see today. It is the work of inculturation and diaspora that show us the limits of who we can be as we delve into the intergenerational work of reconciliation, not only with Indigenous populations, but through our efforts globally as we stand as a people of peace. Scripture and history give us a context, but how we understand and develop our reconciliation social models is the critical enterprise we have committed to engage with and nurture in

the years ahead. It is this relational reconciliation model that attends to our work within the Christian community and beyond.

Rev. Tony Snow (BA, MDIV) is a member of the Stoney Nakoda First Nation and the regional Indigenous Minister for the Chinook Winds Region (southern Alberta) for the United Church of Canada where he oversees relationship-building, outreach, and reconciliation programming for denominational, ecumenical and interfaith institutions and organizations. Rev. Snow is an intergenerational clergy representative from the Stoney people, who, along with his brother Rev. John Snow and his sister Student Minister Gloria Snow, follows in his father's footsteps, the late Dr. Rev. Chief John Snow Sr., in his work to live out the treaty relationship and our covenants with one another. Rev. Snow is a descendant of the signers of Treaty 7 in southern Alberta, and a traditional knowledge keeper.
